MPW is one of the UK's leading names in fifth- and sixth-form education, offering a distinctive alternative to traditional schools.

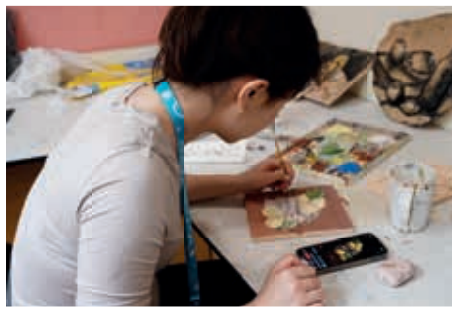

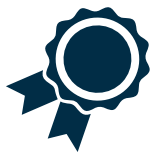

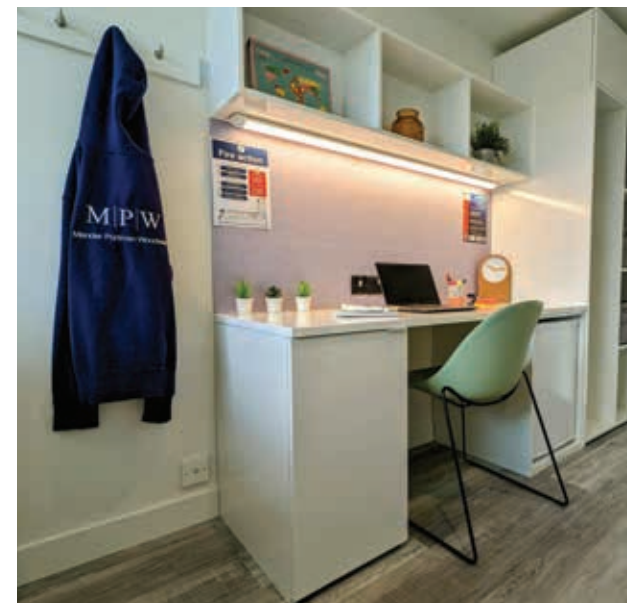
London

Accommodation

Summer school students in London stay at the newly refurbished Queen's Gate House. This outstanding facility provides stylish premium en-suite bedrooms that offer panoramic views across South Kensington. It forms part of MPW's campus and is located just a few minutes' walk from the main college building.



Cambridge

Cambridge is a city steeped in history – home to many beautiful museums, art galleries and stunning architecture as well as the renowned University of Cambridge.

Public Speaking

An essential skill in every area of life, and yet one that is also feared by many people. Improve your ability to speak in all kinds of contexts, from formal speeches in front of audiences to informal presentations in class.

You will learn how to overcome nerves, engage your audience, deal with Academic English and IELTS questions and deliver engaging and controlled talks without a script.

Creative Problem Solving

Creativity and problem solving are among the World Economic Forum’s top skills for the future of work. Learn how to discover the root cause of a problem, generate innovative ideas, and apply them to complex real-life situations. Discover how to craft and improve those ideas in collaborative ways and persist through the creative process by sharing them in visually and verbally imaginative ways.

Resilience

In an increasingly unpredictable world, resilience is an essential skill. Learn strategies for developing greater resilience, including how to conquer fears to achieve your life goals. You will analyse a range of scenarios which will help you bounce back from failure and use key techniques, such as positive thinking, growth mindset, mindfulness, and gratitude.

Making an Impact

To succeed inside as well as outside of the workplace, it’s important to make an impact. Become more assertive, confidently communicate your ideas and opinions to strengthen your influencing skills. Learn how to moderate your body language, build rapport, carefully manage objections, actively listen, and ask questions in the right way to persuade others and achieve your goals.

Entrepreneurship

Companies of all sizes recognise the value of employees with an entrepreneurial mindset. Generate and refine your business ideas and build the confidence to sell your vision to others.

Learn how to progress from the initial stages of identifying opportunities and conceptualising a Minimum Viable Product (MVP) through to delivering your pitch. Plus, get key learnings and practical advice from entrepreneurs.

Critical Thinking

Critical thinking is a valuable skill for academic study, as well as a vital life skill. Top-tier universities use challenging admissions tests and conduct interviews to assess candidates’ capacity to think critically.

Critical thinking is one of the top skills that employers desire. This course enables students to develop the ability to analyse arguments critically, recognise flaws in reasoning and logic, and evaluate the evidence used to support an argument.

Academic English and IELTS Preparation

Students who prefer to focus on improving their English level have the option to study Academic English and general IELTS Preparation, rather than Life Skills. Over two weeks (12 hours of study), experienced English language teachers will guide students through useful lessons in topics such as note taking, academic presentations, vocabulary, pronunciation and listening skills. Fun and interactive lessons encourage students to build confidence and improve language skills in small classes with lots of individual attention.





Enrichment

Our innovative and exciting summer courses provide an opportunity for students to be challenged academically and learn first-hand from industry professionals and university lecturers with opportunities to discuss, debate, and learn about topics they may not otherwise have a chance to experience during the regular school year.

University Lecture series

Our University Lecture series aims to enrich and inspire students. Each week, they will listen to world-leading academics from the University of Cambridge and prestigious London universities, who will explore a wide range of thought-provoking topics.

The lectures, taking place at a university venue, often in grand halls with beautiful architecture, see students learning from university academics about intriguing topics, with a link to current events and new research. Topics such as free speech, gender and race, the mathematics of flight and waves, and exploring a multispecies world are samples of the types of lectures our summer students may experience.

Industry Field trips

London is home to many innovative businesses, while Cambridge is world renowned for leading research and academics. Outside of the classroom, summer students will have excursions related to their academic stream of choice. These valuable learning experiences are excellent chances to explore career options and gain an insider view of the many opportunities for future career success.

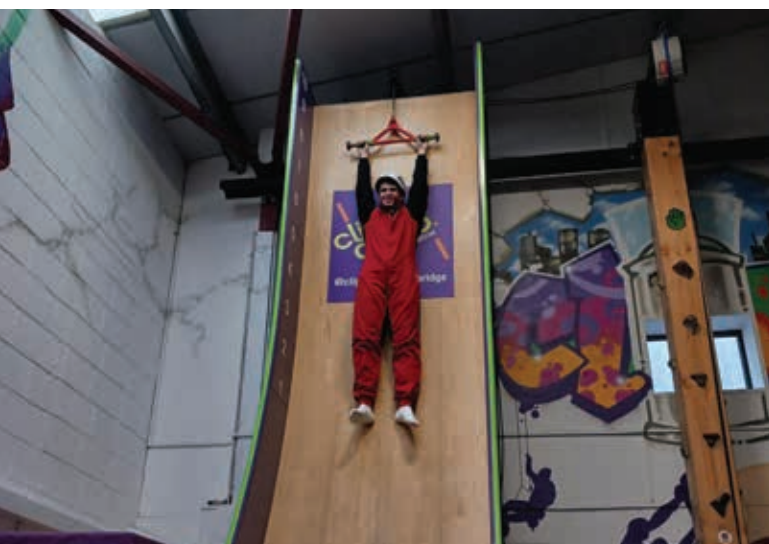
Guest Speakers

Full programme fees include a shared transfer service on our arrival and departure dates during specific times and airports:

London Heathrow (LHR) to/from MPW London

- For flights arriving 30 June, 14 July, and 28 July between 9am-5pm
- For flights departing from 8am - 12pm on 13 July, 27 July, and 10 August.

London Gatwick (LGW) to/from MPW London

- For flights arriving 30 June, 14 July, and 28 July between 12pm-5pm
- For flights departing from 9am - 12pm on 13 July, 27 July, and 10 August

London Stansted Airport (STN) to/from MPW Cambridge

- For flights arriving 30 June and 14 July between 12pm-5pm, and for flights departing from 9am-12pm on 13 July and 27 July.
